HUXLEY SPORTS HISTORY

Huxley High School sports goes way back to 1915 when the 1st girls basketball team was organized with 16 girls participating. The coach was Miss Wyman. Some of the players were M. Berhow, M. Malanger, C. Thompson, L. Kumpley, M. Savereid, M. Ritland, S. Legvold, J. Kalsem, M. Johnson, and A. Fjelland.

There is no record of who they played. The basketball court was played outside on a grass court with basketball hoops.



Here is the Huxley High school basketball team, winner of the Consolidated "6" title, champion of Story county and for the first time in the history of the school a sectional champion, winner of the meet at Nevada. During the season Huxley lost but four games during the regular playing season and won 22 contexts.

The Huxley consolidated school was built in 1921 with a gymnasium that was considered the best in Story County and the Story County Tournament was held at Huxley in 1922 and 1923.

In a Huxonian dated January 1923, an article described the Shipley boys defeated the Huxley boys on Dec. 15, 1922 in a slow and uninteresting game. Score book missing, lost, strayed or stolen – reward, nothing.

They then played Ankeny and were beaten by Ankeny who having just finished a successful football season, showed their superiority by making use of their football tactics by playing rough. The referee showed great skill as a football referee but lacked basketball qualities. Members of that team were Severied, Fjelland, Sheldahl, Thompson, and Kalsem.

The Huxley girls of 1922-23 played Ankeny on December 21, 1922 and won 17-7. The unexpected victory was due to the high Christmas spirit everyone possessed at the time. A box of candy was presented to the team by Miss Cessna, the coach, as a reward for the victory.

On January 5, 1923 they defeated McCallsburg 21-10. The starting 6 on that team were Thompson, Olson, Ritland, Berhow, and Larson.

The 1924-25 baseball team consisted of Orville Kalsem as pitcher and Everett Ritland as catcher.

The girls team of 1932-33-34, won two conference titles in 2 years and were 35-6 over a two year period. Miss Laurie Ruppett was the coach. The starting lineup was Captain Joyce Saveraid and Ilo Tesdall at forward, Lorene Weirsen and Ellen Legvold at the centers, and Beverly Antill and Marie Hellang at the guards. Other team members were Connie Hauge, Javerna Michelson, Ruth Freel, Javerna Maland, and Vivian Ritland.

There were some really outstanding athletes in the late 1930's – early 1940's. The girls of 1939-40 were Kathryn Larson, Opal Tesdall and Opal Sydnes as forwards, guards were Neomi Bjelland, Ruby Fjelland, and Daisey Dobbe.

The boys were both good in both basketball and baseball with Jerry Stoll, Lavern Helland, and Bud Hennick and Leonard Lee were excellent athletes in the early 1940's. They even had track coach by the superintendent, Mr. Golz. They participated in a track meet in Ames with several Story County teams involved.

Morris Helland got 3rd in the low hurdles, Jim Hildreth 4th in the 440 yards, Leonard Lee won 3rd in the 100 yard dash, 2nd in the 220 yard dash, 2nd in the football throw, and 1st in the shot put. Leonard advanced to district meet in Des Moines.

In 1941, a nine game home basketball season ticket cost \$1.65 and a student ticket was \$1.10. Regular admission price was \$.28 - \$.17 per game.

In the mid 1940's the basketball team were very good. Some of the good girls on the basketball team were Lucille Larson, Ruth Lee, Freda Steensland, and Darlene Dobbe.


Punkin Fjelland, Ed Larson, Bob Erickson, and John Hendricks were outstanding for the boys basketball.

In the late 1940's Huxley went from the Big Six to the South Story County Conference of Huxley, Slater, Shipley, Cambridge, Colo, Maxwell, and Collins.

In the late 1940's and early fifties some of the good athletes were Gerald Paulson, Henry Siemers, Arlin Severson, Duane Severson, Frances Rullestad, Owen John Kalsem, Truman Lewis, Ron Myers, Ron Dobbe, Burnie Twedt, Dick Anderson, and Ralph Kalsem.

In 1948 against Sheldahl the baseball team completed a triple play, a feat they accomplished against Slater the previous Fall.

Sheldahl had runners on second and third with nobody out. A swift line drive to the left of shortstop Arlin Severson was snagged by the all-around athlete who whipped it to Truman Lewis at third and then covered second for the return throw from Lewis for the third out as both runners were unable to return to their bases in time and won by 9-4.

In 1950, Homer Kalsem hit a grand slam home run with two outs in the last inning to win over Cambridge 8-4. Later, Huxley advanced to the District tournament by defeating Slater 4-3 in 11 innings. Huxley won in the 11th inning when Ron Meyers blasted a triple and came home on Homer Kalsem's single.

Some of the outstanding girls basketball players of the late 1940's to early 1950's were Izetta Hill, Mary Ann Racek, Valerie Fjelland, Geraldine Fredericks, Donna Longnecker, Carrie Dueland, Janet Saveraid, Gloria Finch, Evelyn Tesddall, and Ramona Sheldahl.

From 1953-1958, the last year of the Old Huxley High, some of the good athletes were Gerald Myers, Leroy "Ace" Downs, John Hillebo, Stan Hillebo, Tommy Erickson, Tom Shaeffer, Earl Dobbe, Arvid Eide, Larry Erickson, Mark Nord, Larry Lein, Ron Swanson, Larry Shaeffer, Ron Rude, Ron Finch, and Nels Nord.

There were a lot of outstanding girls teams from 1953-1958. Carol Wilson, Darlene Kalsem, Joan Anderson, Janice Soderstrum, Mary Lou Berhow, Nona Hill, and Karen Nord were outstanding players.

The 1956-57 Huxley Vikingettes were the only team that ever made it to the "Sweet Sixteen" State Tournament. Brenda Freed, June Kalsem, Sondra Carly, Wanda Snider, Karen Crispin, and freshman Karen Holland all made the All South-Story Conference first team. Brenda Freed, June Kalsem, and Sandra Carly made the Des Moines Register and Tribune All-State honor roll. Wanda Snider was a Sixth Team All-State selection. Over two years this outstanding team was 35-11.

The last Huxley Vikingette team, 1957-58, also was really good and ended up 15-6. Karen Crispin and Wanda Snider made first team All South-Story Conference team. Jean Soderstrum and Wanda Snider were Honor Roll All-State by the Des Moines Register and Tribune.

The last Huxley Viking baseball team was very successful too with a 17-4 record. Larry Shaeffer, Ron Swanson, Larry Lein, Ron Finch, Mark Nord, Nels Nord, and Ron Rude led this outstanding team to the Sub-State Tournament before being beaten by Radcliffe 9-8.

1958 ended an era of old Huxley High Vikings and Vikingettes team when Huxley, Cambridge, Kelley, and Slater merged to form Ballard Community School and were name the Ballard Bombers.

Athletics got off to a good start with the baseball team went to the sub-state tournament behind the great pitching of Larry Shaeffer who eventually would become Ballard Boys Basketball coach and posted a 426-197 record, won 12 conference championships, and seven teams to the State Tournament and eventually was elected to the Coaches Hall of Fame.

Also that Fall of 1958 we had our first football team and Ray Cruse and Nels Nord were the first Captains of the Ballard High School football team.

The 1958-59 Bombers girls basketball team was exceptionally good and went to the "Sweet-Sixteen" State Tournament with a 25-2 record. Tri-Captains of the first Ballard girls basketball team were Gayla Richardson, Patte Locker, and Colleen Twedt.

Over the next 55 years there were a lot of great sports teams at Ballard High winning State Championship in Girls Basketball, Golf, Track, and Wrestling. The 1964 football team was probably the best team in the 55 years of Ballard when they were rated number one in the State in Class.

Ballard teams that won State Championships were: 1994 Boys 2A Track; 1997, 2001, 2007, 2009, and 2010 3A Boys Golf; 2008 and 2009 2A Wrestling; 2009 3A Girls Basketball; and 2012 3A Girls Softball.
