


A word from our president

~ The Huxley Creamery Company ~

Through the late 1880's and early 1890's a big problem confronted merchants of Huxley that bought butter for cash or accepted the butter in trade for merchandise. The problem was that some butter was good, some not so good, and some not fit for human consumption.

The average pioneer housewife made good butter. The secret of the success was sweet cream, coupled with cleanliness and a cool place






A creamery was the answer to correct this problem. From Wisconsin, when the co-op creamery movement was very strong, came reports that they were very successful. Creameries sprang up and were established in Story City, Roland, McCallsburg, Ames, Nevada, and Slater. A meeting of the citizens in and around Huxley was held at the Huxley hall on December 19th 1896 for the purpose of organizing and building a co-op creamery. S.S. Helland was elected chairman and John Johnson secretary.

It was decided A.H. Sheldahl was to go to Roland to gain information to plan a creamery in Huxley and how many cows and how much milk it would require to pay the expenses.

More meetings were held on December 29 and December 31 and anyone who was present who chose to use the Norwegian language was free to do so. The cow committee reported that they had 375 cows that they could get milk from. The Huxley Creamery came into existence the last day of December 1896.

The stockholders chose L.N. Bauge as President, John Stenberg, secretary, and A.L. Kloster as treasurer. Directors were A.H. Sheldahl, Nels R Sydnes, and L.S. Heggen.

They hired J.F. Burrets from the Roland creamery as the buttermaker and he also helped plan the building and buying the equipment.

The creamery opened for business on May 11th 1897 and 10,000 pounds of milk was received. Every year new patrons were added and the results was a good output of butter that that total sales was \$114.000.00.


The creamery incorporated in January 1902 and the name of the creamery was changed from Huxley Farmers Creamery Company to the Huxley Farmers Co-Operative Creamery Company.

P.J. Severaid succeeded Burrets as buttermaker in May of 1900 and served for many years. Other buttermakers were Orcan Olson, O.J. Jensen, Jens Bjing, Leonard Eklund, Ed McCarthy, Palmer Severaid, and Herb Halverson.

The creamery closed down in the early 1960's, but I remember around 1957 or 1958 they served soft serve ice cream on the south side of the creamery.

The deed to the Maland Home has been transferred to the Huxley Historical Society!





I certainly appreciated the Huxonian and especially all about Midvale—it resonated instantly!

Brother Jim (Hwy 69 S. Ames) and I & dad (Porter—Kelley) deceased (buried in Lincoln Cemetery) all went to Midvale a multitude of times! We picked up calf feed, chicken feed, etc. And before coming home Jim & I received a candy bar—the hi-lite of the trip!

The peak years for Midvale (I will speculate) were about 1942 to 1952! Midvale was a "bee-hive" of activity during those years! Many of the customers that counted are resting in Lincoln Cemetery. Including Ole & Porter Kalsem, Grant Rullestead, Stenslands, etc etc. Try to speak to Jim sometime & get his recall on that chapter of history!

Midvale had most of the criteria for incorporation but just not quite enough. Maybe in the "next—life" it will make it!! Ha!
