

# Nord's Notes ~ A word from our president ~

#### **History of the Ballard District**

The Ballard Community School District became an official school district on July 1, 1957, even though the first classes didn't start until Sept. 2, 1958.


The reorganization election was held on May 1, 1957. The result was an 89% approval by voters from Cambridge, Huxley, Kelley and Slater.



Miss Eulalia Jensen, Administrative Assistant in the County Superintendent's Office, is credited with naming the district after Ballard Creek, which flows almost directly across the entire Ballard district.

For the first year of operation, no superintendent of schools was appointed. Each building administrator from the former districts met with the Board of Education each month. Mr. O. E. Lester, who was superintendent of the Huxley Consolidated School District, was appointed superintendent of the Ballard Community School District in 1958.

The Board of Education were: Ole Eide, member at large, represented the former rural independent school districts; L. J. Martin, the Cambridge area, Gerrish Severson, the Huxley area, Clyde Wilson, the Kelley area, Kermit Granseth, the Slater area, Tom Dunlap was treasurer and Burton Tesdall was secretary.



Forty-seven teachers and administrators were employed the first year of organization. In 1957 -58, the total enrollment was 814.

The first year of Ballard in the Fall of 1958, the High School and Junior High were located in Huxley. Slater, Cambridge, and Kelley retained their schools for elementary education.

On August 12, 1960, there was a vote to consolidate the Ballard-North Polk School Districts and a new school to be built just one mile South of Huxley at Hwy 210 and Highway 69, but it failed.

A new High School was built in 1962 and dedication of the new school was September 9, 1962. The new school was located where the Jr. High is now.


It has been 60 years this Fall when Ballard was started on Sept. 2, 1958. The Homecoming Committee honored our class of 59 at the Homecoming Parade this Fall.

I was part of the first Ballard football game played on Sept. 19, 1958 at the Slater Nite-Hawk field against United Community, which we won 15-12. Ray Cruse and I were the first co-captains of Ballard Football and Dean Cramer was the first football coach.

The first senior class of Ballard started on Sept. 2, 1958. Huxley, Cambridge, Slater and Kelley reorganized on May 1, 1957.

There were 31 students from Huxley & Kelley, 12 from Cambridge, and 12 from Slater for a total of 54 classmates. Unfortunately, classmate Dick Warren from Cambridge was killed in a hunting accident over Christmas break. There were 24 girls and 29 boys in the graduating class of "59". The first class of 53 members graduated from Ballard High School on Friday, May 22, 1959.

The class of 1959 will be holding their 60th class reunion in 2019!


