




### Huxley Telephone Company – Early Years to 2023

The town of Huxley had their first telephone office in 1902 which was the year Huxley was incorporated. The office was in back of the A.E. Nass Hardware Store on the east side of South Main Ave.

Some of the early telephone operators were: Minne Eide, Lena Egness, Mrs. Lewis Monson, Mr. Fatland and his daughter, Cora (Fatland) Ryan. (pictured right)

In 1903 a 13-year-old girl took over running the switch board of the Huxley Telephone Company. During that time it was a real job; the switch board consisted of an array of bells, each corresponding to a different line and each line having a different "code" of rings that the operator had to recognize and connect. Through her four years of work for Huxley Telephone Company she learned to recognize the sound of each bell without looking.

The switchboard that Cora operated was located in the jewelry store and later moved to various locations including above the bank at North Main Ave. and 1st street where it stayed until Huxley Telephone Company built a new building in the 1980s. The switchboard was equipped with 12 country lines and 32

in-town 'drops." There were sometimes as many as 10 or 12 people on a line. Also on the switchboard was a toll line to Nevada, where connections were made to call Des Moines. Telephone service to Slater was free.

Some of the managers of the Huxley Telephone Company in the early years were: Henry Birkestrand, Clarence Bergeson, and Bert Haverman. Other managers of record are: J.F. Kalsem (1924), Milo Havens (1934), H.J. Birkestrand (1943), I.J. Hendricks (1946), Rose Heggen (1947), Charles Busby (1950), Lyle Powell (1965), Billy Hotchkiss (1980), Gary Clark (2020) and Levi Bappe (2020).

According to journal records of the board meetings of the Huxley Mutual Telephone Company, records indicate a meeting was held on February 2, 1925, and it was listed as the eighth annual meeting.



Lillian Busby was the switchboard operator at Huxley Communications for 25 years.

On August 31, 1937, a special meeting was called concerning the incorporation of the telephone company and to accept the new by-laws. In October 1937, it was voted on and carried to incorporate the name changed to Huxley Cooperative Telephone Company. On April 4, 1956, dial telephones were installed.

In the early years the telephone office was located in the south part of Main Street in different buildings. It was moved to the second story of the old bank building in 1908. When the Huxley Post Office was moved into the Huxley Hardware building in the 1970s, the Huxley Telephone Company moved to the first floor where the Post Office had been. In 1980 the business was moved across the street west in the building which was known as the Charley Miller Apartments.

After 45 years, the old Huxley Telephone building was demolished and a new building was completed on the same site at 102 North Main Avenue and 1st Street at a cost of \$250,000. The new telephone building added much to the appearance of "Old Huxley." The modern brick structure housed new modern telephone equipment in the 2,6080 square feet of the office space for employees.

Robert Stensland was the architectural and interior designer and Endicott Products Brick, represented by Gary Davis, supplied the brick for the new building. It took eight months to build and was opened for business on May 29, 1981.

On Saturday, July 25, 1981, Huxley Co-op Telephone Company had an open house for their new building.

In 2022, a new multi-million dollar building was built at the South Main Avenue and Campus Drive, Huxley.
